"Let Us Bring Back the Ark ..."

Read 2Sam 6:1-15; 1Ch 13:1-14; 15:1-15

The ark was a wooden box between 3-4' long, about 2' wide and 2' high. The ten commandments were put in the ark and it had a pure gold lid called the "mercy seat." It was a reminder of the nation's covenant relation with God (note v6). The ark had been in Kiriath-jearim about 70 years where it had been returned after being captured by the Philistines. Kiriath-jearim about 10 miles W.NW of Jerusalem.

The noble aim, 1Ch13:3, "Let us bring back the ark ..."

How? "on a new cart" 13:7
