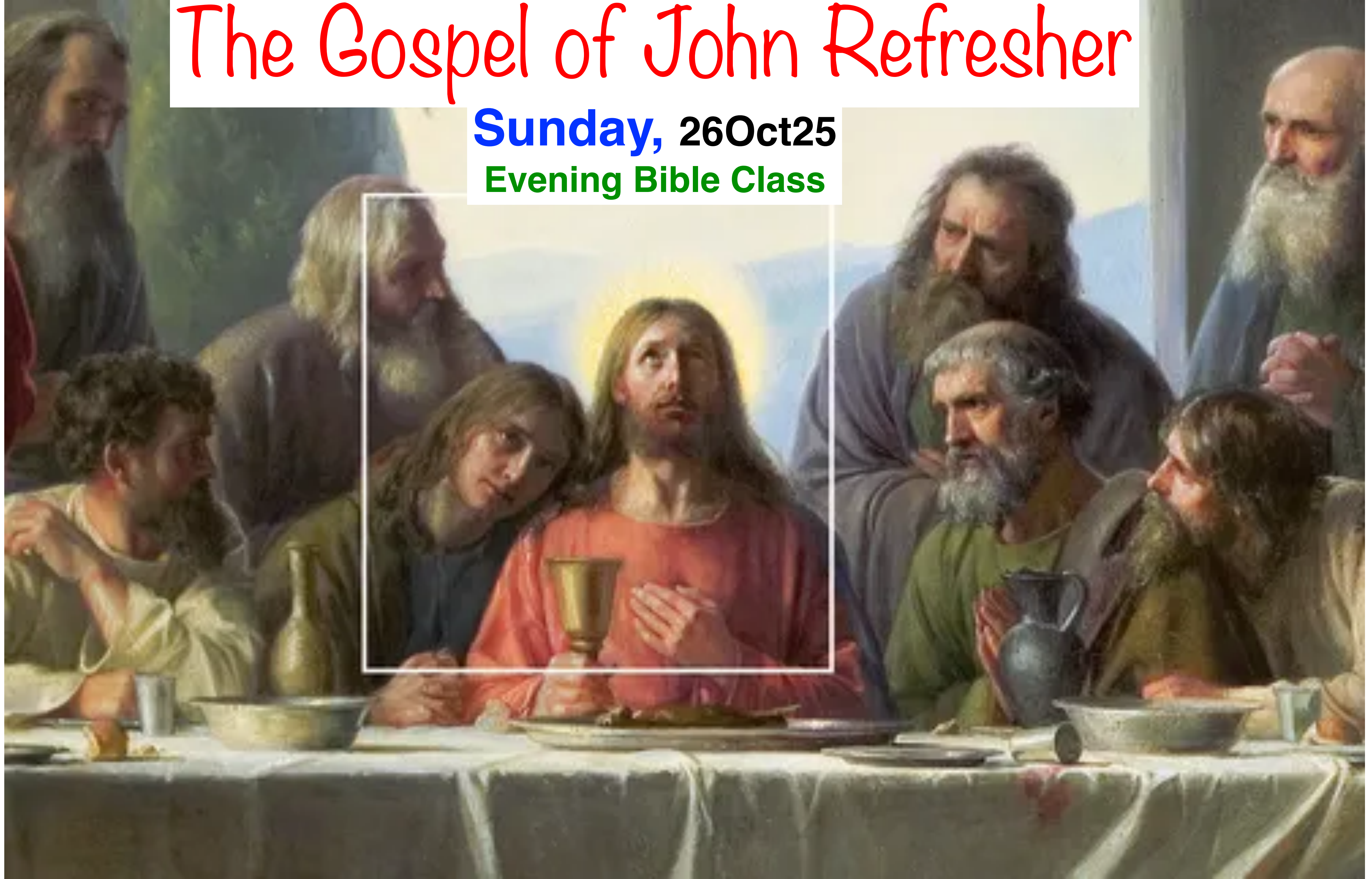


The Gospel of John Refresher

1. Who wrote the Book? How do you know?

John the Apostle.

1. Internal Evidence, 21:25,24,20.
2. Title of Gospel.
3. External Evidence (nearly unanimous).
 - ✦ Irenaeus, Polycarp, Eusebius, Polycrates, Clement of Alexandria.

2. To whom was the Book written?

General/Universal.

3. When was the Book written?

Uncertain: 60-100 AD.

4. Where was the Book written?

Ephesus (secular sources).

5. Why was the Book written?

20:30-31.

Believe Jesus is the Christ,
the Son of God; believing
you have life.

8. What is the connotation of using the word “Word” in vs. 1:1?

Not a single word but word is put for a message, a statement.

10. What are the 3 characteristics of the “Word” defined by the following phrases:

“In the beginning was the Word”

Eternal

“The Word was with God”

Intimate Relationship
w/ Father

“The Word was God”

Deity

11. How is the Word unique,
only Begotten in 1:14?

- Full of grace and truth.

Only Begotten, Unique?

- God Incarnate (14).
- Full of grace & truth (14).
- Grace upon grace (16).
- Grace and truth realized thru JC (17).
- **Only One (God Incarnate) to Carry out God's Redemptive Plan.**

12. What are the 3 parts of the message (“Word”)?

1. Word is Deity vs. 1, 14.
2. Word provides Spiritual Life vs. 4, 12.
3. Believing in the Word provides
Spiritual Life vs. 7, 12.

13. How long did Jesus
Christ ministry last?

3.5 years.

14. How is this timeframe
determined [2:13, 5:1, 6:4,
12:1]?

Using the 4 Passovers
mentioned in this Gospel.

15. Some believe that John 3:16 shows that baptism is not required for salvation since it is not mentioned. How do you respond with this statement?

1). Hearing the gospel not mentioned. Required?

2). Baptism (born of water) is required to enter Kingdom of God (vs. 5)

15. Some believe that John 3:16 shows that baptism is not required for salvation since it is not mentioned. How do you respond with this statement?

3). Example of Moses lifting up serpent shows that “believes” requires action.

4). Harmony of Scriptures (Mark 16:15-26, Acts 2:38, 22:16) requires that “believes” is a figure of speech known as synechode (a part is mentioned but whole is meant).

5). Apostle John taught baptism was required for salvation i.e. remission of sins, Acts 2:38.

Yes.

Vs. 29, 39.

Jesus knew her marital history.

17. What did the Samaritans believe about Jesus?

- He was the Messiah.
- Salvation was for all mankind.
- Savior.
- Possibly recognized His mission was spiritual and not physical.

6:29?

Believe in Him.

20. What does it mean in vs.
6:53 to “eat the flesh of the Son
of Man and drinks His blood”?

Believe in Him.

40 "For this is the will of My Father, that everyone **who** beholds the Son and **believes in Him, may have eternal life;** and I Myself will raise him up on the last day."

54 "**He who eats My flesh and drinks My blood has eternal life,** and I will raise him up on the last day."

Believes In Him ==> Eternal Life (vs. 40)

He who eats My flesh & drinks My blood ==> Eternal Life (vs. 54)

Believes In Him = eats My flesh & drinks My blood

35 Jesus said to them, "I am the bread of life; he who comes to Me shall not hunger, and he who believes in Me shall never thirst.

You eat (Implied) the bread of life.

He *who comes to Me shall not hunger.*

He *who believes in Me shall never thirst.*

Eat = who comes to Me = who believes in Me.

20. In vs. 8:12, Jesus says
He is the Light of the World.
What does this mean?

He provides the
light(knowledge) which leads to
eternal life (light of life).

21. Why is this important to know who Jesus is according to 8:24?

If people do not believe in Jesus, they will die in their sins.

22. What argument does the healed “blind” man in Chapter 9 present about Jesus?

He is a prophet.

22. What happens to the blind man who was cured?

Put out of the synagogue.

23. What does this statement mean when Jesus tells Martha in 11:25, “I am the resurrection and the life”?

He is the one who causes the resurrection of the physical body and He is the one who provide spiritual life.

24. What chapters and verses cover the Passion Week in the Gospel of John?

12:12-20:25, Discourse with Apostles, ch. 13-17, 18-19 trials & crucifixion, 20:1-25 Resurrection.

25. What are the 3 things that the Holy Spirit would convict the world?

Sin, Righteousness, Judgment.

26. Where was the
Apostle John during the
trial with Annas?

With Jesus at trial.

27. How many times will Pilate say “I find no guilt in Him”?

- 3 times [18:38, 19:4, 6].

28. What made Pilate
afraid during Jesus
trial?

When the chief priests say made
himself out to be the Son of God..

29. How do the Jewish Leaders finally convince Pilate to crucify Jesus?

No friend of Caesar and any man who makes himself out to be a king opposes Caesar.

30. When John was in the tomb and looked, the text say he [REDACTED] believed. What did he believe?

- The tomb was empty.

31. How can the
Apostles forgive sins
as recorded in 20:23?

Only God can forgive sins. By their
preaching and people responding to
the gospel message, God can
forgive sins.
