# *Messianic Prophecies*

## OBJECTIVES:

1. Identify when Messianic Prophecy is present.
2. Utilize NT to interpret the prophecy.
3. Understand the main messages of these prophecies.

# *No. of Messianic Prophecies*

1. Ten out of 12 prophets contain Messianic Prophecies.
2. Prophets without Messianic Passages are: Nahum and Habakkuk.
3. There are 22 sections with Messianic Passages.
4. Hosea (1), Joel (2), Amos (1), Obadiah (1), Jonah (1), Micah (3), Zephaniah (1), Haggai (2) and Zechariah (9) and Malachi (1).

# *Identifying Messianic Prophecies*

- ★ Difficult to identify especially when not quoted in NT.
- ★ Keys to identify.
  1. Universal and absolute statements are made that are difficult to physically fulfill by the Jewish nation.
  2. Fulfillment of the prophecies do not fit with their history as we know it.
  3. Includes statements of salvation and redemption for the Gentiles.


# Zion

- ★ Used in the Minor Prophets — an understanding will assist in interpreting Scripture.
- ★ Definition = It is the dwelling place of God among His redeemed people where they find security and peace.

# History of Zion

- ★ A prominent hill in the Jerusalem that David captured from the Jebusites, 2 Sam. 5:6-7.
- ★ David brought the Ark of the Covenant to Zion, 2 Sam. 6:12.
- ★ Solomon moved the Ark of the Covenant from Zion to the temple, which was built on Mount Moriah, 1 Ki. 8:1, 2 Chron. 3:1-2.

# *History of Zion*

- ★ The name Zion was extended to include the **temple**, Ps. 20:2, 74:2-3.
- ★ Zion is often used for the **whole of Jerusalem**, 2 Ki. 19:21,31, Ps. 48:1-2.

# *Zion In Psalms*

- ★ 2:6 -- Messianic – installed my King upon Zion
- ★ 9:11 – Lord dwells in.
- ★ 14:7 – salvation come out of Zion

# *Zion In Isaiah*

- ★ 4:4 – Messianic – Lord washed the filth of the daughters of Zion.
- ★ 10:24 – O My people who dwell in Zion.
- ★ 14:32 -- LORD has founded Zion, And the afflicted of His people will seek refuge in it.

# *Zion In Minor Prophets*

- ★ Joel 3:16 — The LORD roars from Zion ...But the LORD is a refuge for His people.
- ★ Mic. 4:10 — Daughter of Zion ... There the LORD will redeem you From the hand of your enemies.
- ★ Zech. 8:3: I will return to Zion and will dwell in the midst of Jerusalem. Then Jerusalem will be called the City of Truth.

# *Denotation & Connotation*

- ★ Denotation = the explicit or direct meaning or set of meanings of a word or expression ... ([dictionary.com](http://dictionary.com))
- ★ Connotation = the associated or secondary meaning of a word or expression in addition to its explicit or primary meaning. ([dictionary.com](http://dictionary.com))
- ★ Examples: home, dove, dog.

# *Multiple Meanings*

- ★ Literal physical meaning = mountain (mount) where the temple was built upon, [Ps. 20:2, 74:2-3](#).
- ★ Extended literal physical meaning = Jerusalem, [2 Ki. 19:21,31, Ps. 48:1-2](#).
- ★ Spiritual meaning to the Jews = It became a symbol of an impregnable stronghold against its enemies and the dwelling place of God among His people.

# *Multiple Meanings*

- ★ Temple was destroyed due to their iniquities and the Lord had to restore a new Zion.
- ★ Zion = It is the dwelling place of God among His redeemed people where they find security and peace.
- ★ This definition is confirmed in Heb. 12:22-24. We have come to Mount Zion (past tense), we are part of church (universal) – all made possible through the shedding of blood of Jesus Christ.
