

Religious and moral confusion

"There are individuals who struggle with something called 'bodily integrity disorder.' Some of these people feel that an arm or leg doesn't belong on their body. Should we encourage them to remove the arm/leg based on this feeling? No. A loving response will help the person see that the limb is a natural part of who they are, and they should work to align their feelings with their biology.

The same holds true for those who struggle with an eating disorder. You don't tell the 95-pound...16-year-old, 'Your feelings are right; you are too fat.' They need to see that their biology is not the problem, and we can help them work through their *feelings*, which are out of concert with their body" (Seagraves and Leavine, p 40).
