Col 2:20 "have died ... to (from NKJV, ASV) the elementary principles of the world"

"died with Christ" - Conn. with Christ leads to this "death" or separation from "man-made religion" vv20-23

2:6-10 - Know. & apprec. of the gos. of Chr. will stand as barrier to entice. & entangle. in other religions, thus Paul's prayer (1:9-10) & purpose of the letter (1:28-29)

Col 3:5-10 "consider...your...body as dead to ..." "when you were living in.." "laid aside the old self...put on the new self"

3:12-4:6 - the "new self" ... the new "living" in conn. with Christ - "Chr" & pronouns that refer to him: 28 ch1; 19 ch2; 16 ch3; 5 ch4 (2/3 of ch=personal remarks)

The whole exhortation then is CHRIST-CENTERED
