# I. "Day" – yom Refers to 24 hour day when

- Preceded by number such as "I," "2," "3,"
- Used in the plural

"Outside of the Genesis 1 case in question, the two-hundred plus occurrences of yom preceded by ordinals all refer to a normal twenty-four hour day. Furthermore, the seven-hundred plus appearances of yamim [plural of yom] always refer to a regular day."

#### 2. "Evening and Morning" use in Moses' writings = one solar day

- Gen 29:23...25; 49:27; Ex 16:6,7,8,13; 18:13,14; 27:21; Lev 6:20; 24:3; Num 9:15,21; Dt 16:4; 28:67
- Any other meaning contrary to evidence and an assumption

Illus: "Weekend"...? ("Sat & Sun, one weekend")

#### 3. Ex 20:8-11 - "day" / "days"

"...sabbath day...six days you shall labor...seventh day is a sabbath...For in six days the Lord made the heavens and the earth, the sea and all that is in them...rested on the seventh day... blessed the sabbath day" Ex 31:15-17

5. Difficulties with "day" = "ages" Each "day" had "evening"/"morning," "light" /"darkness" ("day/night") vv 4-5

> Plants - 3rd day ... Insects - 5th day vv | |, | 3 ...20,23 (Lev | |:20,2|,23)

#### **Evolutionary** Time

Geologists differ on the age of the earth by millions of years. No reliable dating methods exist to prove the earth older than what the Genesis record indicates. (hourglass illustration ... )



Using an hourglass to tell time is much like using radiometric dating to tell the age of rocks. There are key assumptions that we must accept in order for the method to be reliable. I The rate of radioactive decay is known and has been constant since the rock formed.

2 There has been no loss or gain of the parent or daughter isotopes from the rock.

3 The amounts of parent and daughter isotopes present when the rock formed are known.

- I. Rate constant (rate valve on neck of timer?)
  - Assumption based on uniformitarianism [observation of "50 years out of 5 billion says that we have observed it for say .000001% of its lifetime" – stock market?]
  - Evidence of changes in rate of decay [see quotes]
- 2. No loss or gain (add salt, remove salt?)
  - Impossible to know the effect of weather, water, gases over millions, billions of years
- 3. Amount present when rocks formed (how much salt to begin with?)
  - Radioactive elements can be inherited from source area (magma/rocks)
  - Samples taken a few feet apart can give ages that differ by many hundreds of millions of years

#### Evolutionist William Stansfield, Ph.D., California Polytech State, has stated:

"It is obvious that radiometric techniques may not be the absolute dating methods that they are claimed to be. Age estimates on a given geological stratum by different radiometric methods are often quite different (sometimes by hundreds of millions of years). There is no absolutely reliable long-term radiological 'clock'." William D. Q: "Light" & "darkness" without sun (days I-3)?
Jer 32:17 "Nothing too difficult!" "sunlight" Plants without seeds?! vv11,12
Gen 1:14 "for signs and seasons"

Deny electricity...? airplane...?

Q: The seventh day has not ended ... thousands of years... other "days" in the same way?

Arg. #I – no statement about the 7th day like other days vv5,8,13,19,23,31

Ans: 7th day different — no creative work Clearly, "7th day" = normal day Ex 20:8-1 Q: The seventh day has not ended ...thousands of years...other "days" in the same way?

Arg. #2 - Heb 4:1-9 .... God's Sabbath rest remains for us to enter, therefore His Sabbath is continuing and the seventh day is not considered to have ended.

Ans: Does the text say that the 7th day, the day God rested, is continuing until now? Beware of assumptions!

Q: The seventh day has not ended ... thousands of years... other "days" in the same way?

Arg. #3 - Jn 5: 6-8 ... the Father is still observing the Sabbath, therefore it has not ended.

Ans: Does the text say God is still observing the Sabbath of creation? Beware of assumptions!
