



Q5.5 Look up the definition of "born" in dictionary and in Strongs (G1080). How is the phrase "born again" used in this text?

Dictionary(AH):1. a. Brought into life by birth. b. Brought into existence; created: A new nation was born with the revolution. Strongs: "figuratively to regenerate". New Life. Q5.6 A key phrase to understand the meaning in this text is "born of the Spirit" (vs. 5, 6, 8). Jesus explains the meaning by using a contrast and an analogy (vs. 6,8). What are two ways the word "Spirit" could be interpreted?

Holy Spirit, Human Spirit.

Q5.7 What are the characteristics of the wind mentioned in vs. 8? Does this analogy support the Holy Spirit or human spirit?

Invisible, exists (hear it, see its effects), do not know it's path. Supports - human spirit.

Q5.8 What is being contrasted in vs. 6?

Physical vs. Spiritual.

Q5.9 Now, what does the phrase to be "born of the Spirit" mean?

Experience a new spiritual life.

Q5.10 The kingdom of God is mentioned in vs. 3 and 5. What is the difference?

Vs. 3: Experience the Blessings of Messianic Rule. Vs. 5. Requirements to enter. **Q5.11** There are two requirements to enter the Kingdom. For the first requirement, what does it mean to be "born of water", Rom. 6:4?

To be baptized.

Son of Man must be lifted up that whoever believes in Him may have eternal life.

Lifted up on a cross, His death.

Q5.18 What is the first word in the "golden verse" in the Bible (3:16)? What is the significance of this word?

"For". Connecting word on previous verse and explains the reason for the previous heavenly message.

"No. Note the "not/but". Emphasis is to save mankind.

3). Example of Moses lifting up serpent shows that "believes" requires action.
4). Harmony of Scriptures (Mark 16:15-26, Acts 2:38, 22:16) requires that "believes" is a figure of speech known as synechode (a part is mentioned but whole is meant).
