Mt 24:45-25:46 = 2nd coming ---- NOT A.D. 70

<u>UNIVERSAL judgment</u> on all, NOT on Jewish nation *alone*

- Only to Jews and who lived previous to 70 A.D.? where in the text?
- "All the nations" v32 Israel; Jews?

Examples of NT usage of "nations" (G1484) ...

Mt 24:14 "gospel...preached in the whole world ... all the <u>nations</u>"

Mt 28:19 "make disciples of all the <u>nations</u>"

Ac 2:5 "every <u>nation</u> under heaven" see vv9-11

Rom 16:26 gospel made known to "all the <u>nations</u>"

Gal 3:8 "All the <u>nations</u>" be blessed in Abraham - from Gen 12:3

Contrast 23:36-24:3,15-18—Jerusalem...temple...Judea

Mt 24:45-25:46 = 2nd coming ---- NOT A.D. 70

<u>Judgment based on</u> — not their Jewish history (23:32-34... 37-38) — but <u>attitude toward Christ' DISCIPLES</u>

v40 "to the extent that you did it to one of these <u>brothers of Mine</u>, even the least of them, you <u>did it to Me</u>."

Jesus' reference to his "brothers"/"brethren" — six times. The other five times: Mt 12:49; 28:10; Mk 3:34; Lk 8:21; Jn 20:17.

Refers to his <u>disciples</u>, not "brothers" by biology or race.

v45 "to the extent that you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it to Me"

General benev. based on "neighbor" rela.—not rela. to Christ Lk 10:25f

Mt 24:45-25:46 = 2nd coming ---- NOT A.D. 70

Finality

<u>Parable of the virgins</u> — vv10-12 "door is shut" & not be opened... Could people enter the kingdom (v1) *after* AD70? If so, Mt 25 NOT about AD70!

<u>Parable of the talents</u> — vv21,23 faithful slaves: "enter the joy of your Master; vv26,20 lazy slave: "place ...weeping & gnashing of t." Could people repent after AD70? If so, Mt 25 NOT about AD70!

<u>Judgment scene</u> v32 "separate them" — v34 "inherit the kingdom" / 41 "Depart...into the eternal fire"; v46 "eternal punishment...eternal life" Could a change his destiny (by repentance) after AD70? If so, Mt 25 NOT about AD70!
