Q: "Gambling"..... including things that some people may not realize is gambling, such as the lottery...

What is "gambling"? Define. (Two different definitions—one OK, one...our study)

- "n. an act or undertaking involving risk of loss" e.g., farmer, business, etc.
- "v.i. to play games of chance for money or some other stake" - our study (defin. > WNWD)

"Gambling" we are studying by design depends on the inevitable loss of others

Examples:

- Casino: Roulette wheel, cards (e.g. Blackjack), slot machines
- State, national: Lottery, scratch off
- Sports: Horse & dog races, football pools
- Local: Pitching pennies, raffles, "bingo"

not "seek own" ['good,' interest] ... but neighbor's [good, well-being' NKJV]

Eph 4:28 Working to provide, not rob I Co 5:10, 6:10 Swindling - ?

By design, gambling depends on the inevitable loss of others regardless of their suffering. Harm to fellow man is inherent in its practice.

- Does the loss associated with gambling cause injury to society?
- Is it isolated or widespread?
- Is it uncommon or usual?
- Do people suffer as a result of legalized gambling?

Studies and history point to ...

- Destroys families
- Increases crime (street and organized)
- ▶ Especially negatively impacts poor & low income

- Lk 12:15f "Beware, and be on your guard against every form of greed/coveteousness"
 - God Jos 7:21, ITim 6:10, Jer 6:13
 - Man Ex 20:17; Rom 13:9 ... Mic 2:2, Jer 22:17

The tendency to ignore all the warnings of reason and revelation because one wants to gamble is precisely "covetousness"!

- ▶ Rom 12:17; 2Co 8:21; ICo 9:19-22
 Provide for things honorable in the sight of men
 - Forbidden, spoken against by many religious people.
 - Outlawed in many states due to its harmful social effects
 - Invites organized crime; fosters embezzlement; breeds political corruption; creates economic waste and poverty. Sports stand against it.

- ▶ Rom | 3:1-7 violates civil law
- ▶ Co 8:12,13 cause others to sin

Q: Cannot the same be said of TV, sensual attire?

Answer:

- If it can, does it make gambling OK??
- Same rule applies...! Turn the TV channel; change attire!

- What principles in the following scriptures bear on "gambling"...?
- ► Gen 2:5...15; ITh 4:11-12; 2Th 3:10

 Militates against God's plan for all to work
 - God's author. plans for obtaining possessions
 - a) Exchange: whether of
 - service Eph 4:28; 2 Th 3:8; Lk 10:7, or,
 - goods Mt 25:27; 13:44-46; Ac 16:14
 - b) Gift: Eph 4:28; Ac 11:29ff

No difference than farming, business

- Difference in THIS gambling, someone must lose and someone WILL lose.
- Illustration
 - Bus. invest., stocks ALL to GAIN
 - Gambling MOST MUST LOSE

TV? ... cause loss of time, money, family?

- Difference in gambling, that someone must lose is INEVITIBLE. TV loss due to misuse.
- BOTH wrong when used to gain at inevitable loss of others!

Proceeds for good causes (jobs, education)

- Cost to repair evil outweigh proceeds?
- Rom 3:8 "do evil that good may come"?
- Robin Hood

Not condemned by name

- True but neither is "nudity," "pushing drugs," "pornography," "suicide."
- Bible not encyclopedia. Principles to be applied. See scriptures throughout lesson.

Limited amount, so negligible loss or injury

- How limit? People buy multiple tickets.
- Where draw the line?
- Sure way to avoid never start. Tim 6:10

Not gamble for money, but for fun

- Then leave the money out!
- "Fun" justify harm to others, undermine influence for Christ?

Those involved "agree" to whatever loss they suffer ("by consent").

- Justify wife-swapping, fornication, dueling, suicide ... ?
- Rom 1:32

Everybody takes a risk. Life is a gamble.

- Define the KIND of "gambling" discussed Compare: Everybody has "sex." Therefore "sex" between the unmarried OK!
- Farmer successful BOTH he and consumer benefit; Gambler successful someone SUFFERS LOSS.

- Provide wholesome entertainment, duties for children
- Learn and teach children the evils of this and other allurements
